 May 20-21, 2017 Sixth Sunday of Easter
 John 14:15-21



In a parish where many of you have served in the military or are on active duty, I thought that this little snippet from an old army manual might make you chuckle:

SIT REFLECTION

With Mother's Day behind us, there is a story I wanted to share that is heartbreaking to its core from *The Christian Times*, but shows the sacrifice our brothers and sisters around the world routinely must make when facing the ultimate decision of staying true to faith.

Often that sacrifice is experienced by fathers ... and, yes, by mothers, when the resolute nature of faith will not bend, even when one has to say goodbye to a loved one.

In the spring of 2016, an Assyrian mother and her daughter were visited by ISIS militants in their Iraqi home. As typically is the case ISIS demanded a hefty tax (*jizya*) if they would not convert to Islam, or else they must leave the premises instantly. Shaken, the mother pleaded for just a few minutes so she could tell her daughter to get out of the shower and be prepared to leave.

The request was denied.

"You don't have a few minutes," the militants replied as they torched the abode and fled. The mother frantically tried to find an entrance to retrieve her 12-year old daughter amidst the flames. As the fire died down a bit, the mother was able to grab her daughter from the house, rushing her to the hospital. But the flames had done their damage.

A few hours after arriving at the hospital, the young girl died in her mother's arms, but just before that moment the daughter taught her mother one of the most selfless lessons ever imaginable. She uttered, 'Forgive them' as she left this world, and entered into Jesus' kingdom.

Stories like these happen in one form or another around the world, and will never be told. We cannot fathom what creates such tunnel-vision evil set to rip apart families, but we can appreciate the victims as real life examples of Jesus on earth—turning the other cheek, accepting earthly consequence for the opportunity to crawl into our Savior's arms in Heaven. As Father Larry Richards once said, "If we truly felt in our hearts how glorious eternity with Jesus actually will be, the line for Mass would be out the door every single day."

I can speak for fellow SIT members that stories like these bring us closer to Him ... and to those who have made those sacrifices. It shows us how far we have to go to secure that strong faith, but gives us hope that amidst the most sinister evils, forgiveness and glory in God is just a fading breath away if we so choose it.

PAPER RECYCLING

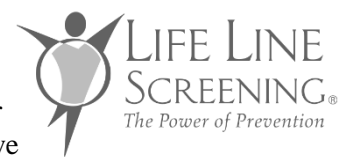
Do not bring any more paper from home to put in our paper recycling dumpster. The dumpster has been removed.

HEALTH SCREENING – JUNE 29TH
